I apologised for the situation but was pleased to announce to them that they will be some of the last to do so. The access to the museum has restricted so many over the years and it is wonderful that this will soon be over. My heartfelt thanks goes to Elish Hagenson for being the inspiration to make this happen. Also thanks to the many volunteers who invested there time and resources into the design and fundraising to make this project happen. You have no idea the impact you will have on people's lives.

We have appointed Aaron Collins as the primary builder of Urenui as part of the specifications was to use local contractors where appropriate. Aaron has indicated construction to begin in May and will most likely continue into September.

For public safety reasons during this time the museum will be closed, however this does not mean that nothing is going on inside. Kath and the team of volunteers are really looking forward to this time where they can get busy creating new displays, so the museum will also look different on the inside as well. Our Gallery volunteer, Emma is doing a marvellous job managing the gallery. Knowing that there are many talented local artists but maybe don't have enough work for an entire exhibition, she is co-ordination a collective exhibition from the district. #### **AHITITI HAS A FIELD DAY**

#### CONTESTS FOR CHAMPIONSHIPS KEEN COMPETITION SHOWN

Taranaki Daily News 4 March 1933

Capturing the championship banner as well as taking the Herbert Smith point cup for the greatest number of points in all events, the boys relay race cup and the junior championship in both the boys and girls sections, the Ahititi School had a field day at Awakino yesterday. To complete the days successes Miss Fuller, the teacher at Ahititi won the teachers race for the second year in succession.

Eight schools, embracing the area from Mahoenui to Mount Messenger, took part in the sports, and it was refreshing to note the enthusiasm with which the children entered into the races and the sportsmanlike manner in which they accepted victory or defeat. They showed considerable speed and stamina and from the style displayed it was evident that the teachers had been taking a keen interest in their physical training. Though the roll numbers at the majority of the competing schools was small there were large entries in the events, numerous heats being necessary, showing that the majority of the children were taking part.

Ahititi, which filled the position of runner-up last year took both the championship banner and aggregate cup from Awakino which won them on two previous occasions.

Ahititi retained the Herbert Smith relay cup whilst Mt Messenger captured the girls relay cup previously held by Awakino.

The gathering was also in the nature of a picnic, the children being provided with cocoa which was dispensed by Mesdames L Jones, H Gray, W Winstanley and Miss E Garcia. A soft drinks and ice cream stall also did splendid business.

#### **BEYOND THE AWA IN CLIFTON**

RATES INCREASES are coming. Expect something between 10-13% added to your rates bill for next year as council battles with increasing costs. Problem is, and what they fail to acknowledge is that increasing costs are affecting us as well, and while we must cut the cloth to suit or reinvent ways we do things, corporate council still seams to take the cost-plus attitude. And worst of all is history telling us that it's the rural sectors that will take the hit with reduced services as distant voices are not as loud as the one across the street. To get your concerns out there, the best method is to directly email our Ward Councillor, Tony Bedford at tony.bedford@npdc.govt.nz Don't hold back, he is there to represent you. And if you think one email doesn't matter, I tell you it does when a handful of submissions can dictate the outcome of something that impacts on 120,000 residents.

Your Clifton Community Board members, and I must say, all Community Boards, are taking a stand against councils inept to look within and change the way they do things. It's so bureaucratic and risk avert that that this has blinded them to the opportunity within, and there many. Anyway, we all have our sou'westers on and are facing into the storm, and while we are most likely to get snotted, they are going to hear it anyway.

While we deal with the raw with what lies immediately ahead, we must remember that council plans are really long term strategies which get reviewed every 3 years. This cycle has started again with the review of the Community Board Plans which feed into the next council Long Term Plan (LTP), which sets and prioritises activities for the next 10 years. The Clifton Community Board has developed a survey to gauge residents mood of the current plan and to seek your ideas and thoughts of what to include, or exclude in the next one.

Its takes 5 minutes, but your thoughts can impact for years. There is also a free text field to really express your mind.

The last LTP council changed its moto to "The Lifestyle Capital of NZ" which can tend to overlook all the hard mahi by the farmers and businesses that created the base where one could promote this sort of glorious statement. Maybe we should get back to basics and return to the old one;



## Mokau Ratepayers Association (MRA) - Meeting with Waitomo District Council (WDC)

Minutes of Meeting of the Mokau Ratepayers Association and Waitomo District Council, held in the Mokau Hall Saturday, 7 January 2023.

**Present from WDC:** John Robertson (Mayor), Gavin Todd (Councillor), Ben Smit (Chief Executive)

John Robertson updated the meeting on the activities of Council and the Elected Members and some of the work that had been undertaken in Mokau – primarily the construction of new public toilets and sewerage drainage upgrade and the drinking water treatment and reticulation upgrade.

Discussion and comments from the MRA centred around:
