MOKAU DISTRICT NEWS ATHLETIC MEETING RESULTS

Taranaki Daily News 31 October 1933

The fourth meeting of the Tainui Amateur Athletic and Harrier Club was held at Mokau on Saturday. The weather was fair and there were a large number of spectators.

A senior cycle race from Mokau to Awakino junction and back, a distance of ten miles, was won by P Sheen, Mokau, off the 3 minute mark, his time being 33 minutes. I Hammond (scr.), Mokakatino, was second and B Bryant, Awakino, third. I Hammond made fastest time, covering the distance in 30 minutes.

The junior cycle race of one mile was won by N Bishell, Mohakatino with D Opie, Mokau, second.

A junior harrier race over a course of approximately half a mile was won by W Welch, Te Kawau, K Winstanley was second and R Winstanley was third.

The putting the shot event was won by J Bryant, Awakino, 35ft 1in. L Bryant Awakino was second with 31ft 10in, and K Welch, Te Kawau was third with 31ft 7in.

It was decided to hold the next sports meeting on November 11, when a relay race will be included in the programme.

There is a defibrillator on the front wall of the St John building, to take it out of its lock box call 111 and ask for the code to unlock. There are others around the district. To find out where the closest is to you I suggest you download the app AED locations – its free and this shows where the closest AED is to where you are which can save vital moments in an emergency.

Daylight savings is here, time to shake off those winter blues, get out into the fresh air and make the most of the longer, warmer days. Do remember to take care around our beautiful beaches and rivers. I have had seen two people in recent weeks who have had close calls with rogue waves and strong rips.

CLIFTON COMMUNITY BOARD

BEYOND THE AWA IN CLIFTON

Every 6 years by law, Council must review the way they manage and facilitate the districts refuse. As part of this Officers have produced a Draft Waste Management & Minimisation Plan which will guide the focus in this space for the next 6 years and continues its ambitious goal of Zero Waste 2040. This document briefly summarises the progress to date, research data of where the current short comings are and some actions they hope will close these gaps. <u>https://www.npdc.govt.nz/community/have-your-say/consultations/draft-waste-management-and-minimisation-plan/</u>

This document went out for community consultation of which the Clifton Community Board made a submission. As part of this we created a short survey to gain a better understanding of the thoughts out there and I thank those who contributed to forming the response. Essentially the town models of managing rubbish do not work well out in the rural communities and the feedback that was consistent is that the current service is largely inaccessible, inefficient, and very expensive. There is no question that some infrastructure is needed in rural areas to help us reduce our environmental footprint, and while most really want to the right thing the trouble is that council expects this at their convenience. Its time to think smarter in this space to make self service options available at minimal cost. Let's see if we can get this message across.

I attended an event hosted by NP Business Chamber where local politicians, the 3 Taranaki district councils, TRC and Waka Kotahi got to view their points on the state of SH3 and indeed the entire roading network. As usual its always about prioritising the cash pot to the most urgent need, however it was commonly accepted that the state of the overall asset had been run down. Interestingly, or as anticipated, road cones came up. Did you know that 30-50% of project cost is now spent on these things? Yep, and believe it or not this is getting attention as they try to make the dollar go further, and about jolly time as well.

However, the thing I mostly got from this meeting is the need for our community board to be more active in the Taranaki Transport Forum. This is the best space to get our community needs across and hopefully more action on things that matter the most to us. Could well be pissing against the wind but will give it a go anyway.

Just on SH3 there is some resealing work coming up north of the Tongapōrutu bridge and traffic management will be in place for the 3-4 week period

TAINUI WETERE DOMAIN

More people, less sheep is our guiding mantra. However, those white fluffy things preform an essential role in keeping the grass down. The problem has been in keeping the little beggars off the main road. Thanks to Kane and his crew the boundary road fencing is now complete, and we can rest more easily knowing that we have this traffic responsibility under control.

A few people form WRC came down to see what we have done along the riverbank. They are suitably impressed on what we have managed to achieve on our own so far. They gave some advice on what more can be done in the erosion zone and sourced some more suitable plants for us. Thanks to those who helped us get these in the ground.

A month or so back Council approved the Domain Reserve Management Plan (RMP). While its sounds like a bit of fluff, it is an important document. During the consultation process the domain name got officially changed to "Tainui Wetere Domain", and now recognises the whānau who gifted the land for "sports and games" back in 1938. The other thing this does is allows a legal process to begin in establishing a formal lease agreement with Council, and access to funds via WRC and other organisations. This will enable the committee to do more in the domain for the overall benefit of our community.
