

STORM PRODUCES HIGHEST MOKAU TIDES IN MEMORY

15 January 1997

MOKAU - The coastal towns got a bit of lashing from Cyclone Drena, but more as a result of extremely high tides and river flooding than from wind and rain damage.

Local historian Ian Whittaker said he'd never seen anything like it.

"It was the rough seas rather than the storm," he said. "We got tremendous tides..."

He said the Tainui-Wetere Domain and Mokau River Road were both under water on Saturday for around three hours, and several vehicles were trapped at Tongaporutu by logs on the road.

He said the river was the highest he'd ever seen, "It just got higher and higher and higher - by gee, it was high!"

In some places, such as on the south bank of the Mokau river, erosion has increased.

Awakino resident Sally Fenning said she saw two metres of the bank fall away into the sea almost under her feet.

"I suddenly realised what was happening and then six foot of the bank disappeared," she said. "It was quite frightening really, quite frightening."

High tides were also reported at Kawhia with water lapping around the Kawhia Fish Shop.

Well, if there was no last minute, then I am sure nothing would get done. With a hiss and a roar, and armed with a shovel, rake and paint brush, the museum got tidied up for the opening. The weather gods were kind to us, and I reckon there was over 80 people who travelled out to celebrate the day with us. It was a shame that lan wasn't able to be there, but he was on our minds, and having Aunty Jessy and Elish to cut the ribbon and lead the way up the ramp was a real treasure. The day was a huge success and I thank everyone involved in pulling it together.

Kath and the team have created over 20 new displays, and all on a shoestring. Many items that were in storage are now out telling their story, and the archives area has had a real going through. Boxes of photos, letters and information just kept coming out of the woodwork. Each item that had local relevance was scanned then filed to enable them to be found easier. Also gone is the old noisey paniola, which has been replaced with a unit in top condition, donated by a family, (not from the area) who were downsizing and no longer had room for it. Send the kids in.

The new FirstGas and Mt Messenger displays have really captured the work of large-scale investment in the area. People are always interested in what is going on in this space and the museum is honoured to have partnered with these companies so that the public can be informed.

If you think someone has left the lights on, please don't call. The night displays lit up in the windows has been a creative use of space, and it means that travellers can have a wonder while they wait for their burger.

The museum had been closed for 7 months while the accessibility ramp was being constructed. This time was wisely used to make such a big difference inside and I thank all the volunteers that made it happen. And while I uncomfortably received lots of accolades on the day for the work done it really has been a team effort. E hara matou toa i te toa takitahi, he toa takitahi. "Our strength is not as an individual, but as a collective".

Starting soon - PHYSIO SERVICE

Te Whatu Ora is funding a free physiotherapy clinic in Mokau once a month in 2024. The physiotherapist is called Louise Robinson and has been working as a physio in Taranaki for the last 8 years.

This clinic is primarily designed for people with long term musculoskeletal conditions, for example arthritis or persistent low back pain.

As the clinic is only running once a month it is not suitable for people with acute injuries or ACC cases.

People can access this physio clinic through a referral from any health professional (GPs, specialists, nurses). Appointments will be made through Louise and the physio department at Base hospital.

The clinic will be held in the Mokau Nurse Clinic rooms in the St John building.

The first date is yet to be confirmed but future dates will be in the Trader.

BEYOND THE AWA IN CLIFTON

Happy New Year guys. Hope that you all had a Merry Christmas and now that its over for another year you are finding time to kick back and enjoy the holiday time with family and friends.

Last month I reported that we need to do something at Umukaha Point to safely direct visitors so they can take the famous photo shot of Taranaki. Community Board members met up with Ngāti Tama and council Officers in Dec to take a wonder and to see for ourselves what could be done in the short term to make this safer. Ironically while we were there, visitors came and went to an area where the cliff is crumbling, which I think hammered it home that this work is urgent. In the longer term we look forward to partnering with Ngāti Tama in the signage narrative to improve the visitor experience.

Council has contracted a new rubbish collection provider who starts in October. Once the team gets back on board, they with the Community Board are establishing a focus group to investigate the best ways to provide services to rural communities. Once we have nutted this out, we hope to set up a trial site in the area which then in the long term can be rolled out across all rural sectors throughout the district. I will be focusing on ways to make recycling services more accessible and economic so that less is sent to landfill, official or otherwise. Will keep you informed.

In the media you would have heard a lot of talk about the Long-Term Plan (LTP) and the expected impacts on future rates. Once all the shouting is over the document will go out for public consultation and everyone will have an opportunity to address their concerns. Will let you know when this process begins.

While you are on holiday, most of council is as well. However essential services remain and if you notice something that needs attention, please register a service request either by the NPDC app, phone 06 759-6060, or email enquiries@npdc.govt.nz Your message will be captured and actioned.




