LOADED LORRY SLIPS ON EDGE OF HILL ROAD

Taranaki Daily News 2 July 1953

The trailer of a large, specially constructed articulated lorry, carrying massive 70 foot lengths of steel for the new Tongaporutu bridge, slipped and came to rest partly over the edge of a bank about half way up Mt Messenger at about 1 pm yesterday.

No one was injured but the steel had to be manhandled from the trailer before it could be hauled back on to the road by a break-down truck operated by Mr R Allen, Uruti. The driver of the lorry was Mr S Warren, Mokau, a member of the firm of Warren and Treweek Ltd, which has the contract for the transport of the steel.

The rear wheels of the trailer sank into the rain sodden verge of the winding roadway, causing the vehicle to slip part of the way down the bank. Bush and scrub growing on the steep bank and the main structure of the trailer prevented it from slithering completely over.

Ministry of Works workmen and members of the contracting firm worked hard to unload the steel from the trailer and pile it on the road.

Traffic on the highway was held up for some time while the road was cleared. The lorry was left there last night, adequately lighted. The contractors intend to return to New Plymouth for another load of steel today, transporting the steel at present on the road to Tongaporutu later.

CLIFTON COMMUNITY BOARD

BEYOND THE AWA IN CLIFTON

Your community board welcomes our new elected member, Theresa Hayston of Urenui. Its good to have the team full again and I look forward to working with Theresa on behalf of the community we represent.

As a board we want to make ourselves more accessible to the various communities within the Clifton district. To this end we have decided to hold a board meeting at least once per year in each area to enable local residents to come along, meet their representatives and tell us of anything of concern. This time it is Uruti's turn, and the next meeting is at 4pm on Thursday 4th July in the hall.

Last month council officers and the board met with the Mohakatino Rd residents to talk about the state of the road. Its was good to hear that all the potholes will be repaired properly, and the entire sealed surface will have another coat put on top during the coming summer. Despite media comments that some rural roads could be heading back to gravel, it was pleasing to all to hear that this will not be happening to Mohakatino Rd. Thanks to all those who turned up. It sent a clear message to council that the road is important to all.

I also managed to have a conversation with a NZTA representative on the Taranaki – Waikato roading forum about the recent accidents just north of the Mohakatino bridge. Three trucks upside down in the same spot in less than 3 months. Something is wrong! Its pleasing to see that the road barrier has been prioritised and the road surface is marked for resurfacing.

Every year each district community board receives an allocation of funds for small community projects. During the F24 year the Clifton Board approved funds for a bus shelter at Urenui, welcome to Urenui signage, and some interpretive signage in partnership with Ngāti Mutunga to be installed at the Okoki pa reserve. We are now into the new year and if you have a community project in mind and are looking for funding, give me a call.

BLOOD TEST dates for July - These are the days I can take blood tests into town for processing.

If you need an urgent test, please call me to discuss. I can take blood on any clinic day if you can arrange to get it into town.

WHAT IS BLOOD PRESSURE?

Your heart pumps blood around your body through tubes called blood vessels. Blood pressure is the pressure of blood against your blood vessels as it moves through your body. This pressure is necessary to make the blood flow, delivering nutrients and oxygen throughout your body.

However, high blood pressure, also called hypertension, means there is too much pressure in your blood vessels. This can damage your blood vessels and cause health problems. High blood pressure is one of the main risk factors for heart disease, especially heart attacks and strokes.

If you do have high blood pressure, you can help manage it with some simple changes to your lifestyle, such as eating a heart healthy diet and exercising more. Your doctor might also recommend some medications to keep it under control.

It's possible to have high blood pressure without knowing it, so it's important to have it checked regularly. Come and see us for a free blood pressure check – no appointment needed!
