CHILDREN MISS SCHOOL

Awakino Man Appears in Court Taranaki Daily News 10 February 1934

For failing to send two of his children to school between 27 and 30 November, Mr E Batley, Awakino was convicted and ordered to pay £1 2s costs by Mr W Woodward at the Magistrates Court, Waitara, yesterday.

Taranaki Education Board attendance officer, Mr G Pascoe, said Mr Batley had been fined on a previous occasion. The children who had missed school, Reginald and Teddy respectively. Batley seems a good father and looked after his family well. Attendances of his children had been good in previous years excepting November.

Batley explained that he had a family of 15 children, all living. He was having a "pretty tough" struggle to carry on. His wife had a lot to do. He admitted his children had missed on occasions but he and his wife were doing their best for them.

Batley thought that on the dates in question the two children might have been assisting at home. That was a time when there was extra work to do in connection with sheep and cows on the farm.

Mrs Batley who was called to give evidence said it was her fault the children missed school.

"I want you to understand that this cannot go on", said Mr Woodward to Batley.

"I do not wish to press you if you are having a hard time but you must send your children to school".




