

Fingers crossed.

Although raising funds was harder than previously, we did get some money though to focus on a specific project which has already begun and will run through to June. Thanks to Keith Finnerty of Cat and Mouse Productions after reviewing his budget we were able to employ both Kath and Leisha to pull together the content research on the Tongapōrutu area. They will be knocking on a few doors gathering stories and content, however if you have something pertaining to the area you think is worth collecting and recording, please get in contact with them.

#### MOKAU DISTRICT NEWS from our own correspondent

#### Taranaki Daily News 26 January 1931

\*\*The steamer Kapui, which had been tied up at the Mokau wharf for a few days on account of the bar being too rough, was able to leave on Monday morning.

\*\*A large number of visitors have been undertaking the trip up the Mokau River by the launch, which takes 20 or more passengers.

\*\*Mushrooms have made their appearance in the Mokau district.

\*\*Two kingfish were noticed in the Mokau river on Monday morning, one being caught by Mrs Taylor, who had to get help to haul it in, the fish weighing 40lbs. Many fishing enthusiasts are now trying their luck and seeking the honour of landing the other one which has since been seen in the river between the wharf and the bridge. Several sharks have also been seen cruising about between the "Flower Pots" beach and the wharf but none have been caught yet.

\*\*On the banks of the Mohakatino River are many tents which prove the spot is a favourite one with campers.



#### **BEYOND THE AWA IN CLIFTON**

Happy New Year guys. Not only do we have the best place in the country to enjoy the outdoor spaces, but we have a great community with lots of family activities. My thanks to all those who organise and sponsor the Tongaporutu summer events program.

As soon as the road cone police are back on patrol after the break, they will be setting up shop between Pilot Rd and Rapanui while NZTA do some major work on the short section of SH3. They reckon its going to be 8 weeks or so to reform and seal the road. Throughout this time traffic management will be in place with travel delays expected. While inconvenient it sure beats the potholes. Please be patient

In early December council swapped out the recycle bin as the plastics and paper sections were full. Back at the town recycle depot an audit was carried out on the contents, and it was disappointing that a significant level of contamination was recorded. While most people are conscientious about separating recycling, it appears that a few have yet to get on board. Many of the bags of rubbish jammed through the slot contained recycled items so it appears that some just don't care. The contents of these bags are indicative of the freedom camping activity which is a battle that all councils have across the motu.

As you know council are reviewing our rubbish and recycling options and one train of thought is to relocate everything down to the Hutiwai transfer station and providing locals and holiday residents access via an electronic fob key. This option takes everything from the gravel pit which means there is nothing for the passer by to hide their rubbish in forcing them to take it with them. However, it does mean that we all have to travel up the Hutiwai.

The transfer station does have wifi signal and so council can include some smarts into the access code with options for some security cameras. There should be some annual payment to have access and this needs to reflect a typical annual usage of the Jack Trash bin. But alongside 7-day access to the rubbish bin, recycling options could also be made available, including metals/whiteware and agricultural plastics. I would like to know your thoughts on this.

While Council is largely closed until 20<sup>th</sup> Jan, all main services remain functioning throughout the holiday period and if you notice something that needs attention please still register a service request via the normal options, the NPDC app, phone 06 7596060, or email <u>enquiries@npdc.</u> <u>govt.nz</u>
